




AFFORDABLE & AVAILABLE UNITS PER 100 RENTER HOUSEHOLDS





HOURLY WAGE REQUIRED TO AFFORD A TWO BEDROOM RENTAL HOME BY STATE






HOMEOWNERSHIP RATE IN NEVADA






HOME AND RENTAL VACANCY RATES IN NEVADA




DEMOGRAPHICS OF HOME RENTING NEVADA






MEDIAN GROSS RENT IN NEVADA




RENT BURDEN IN NEVADA






RENT BURDEN BY INCOME IN NEVADA








UNEMPLOYMENT AND EVICTION RATES IN NEVADA

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

Immediate-term response: Keep people in their homes

Extending increased unemployment benefits

Increasing funding for rental assistance

Extending eviction/foreclosure moratoriums

Provide for legal assistance and right to counsel

Mid/Long-term recovery

Coordinated efforts to ensure the housing market and housing delivery system recover with the economy

Building on lessons learned from previous economic downturns





6 Principles of Equitable Recovery



- O1 Black and Brown communities, seniors, small businesses and children are at the center of equitable recovery.
- O2 Equitable recovery is built on cross-sector solutions.
- Equitable recovery builds on successful emergency response.
- 04 Equitable recovery addresses acute fiscal challenges in communities.
- O5 Equitable recovery leverages and aligns funding so that each dollar has multiple impacts.
- 06 Equitable recovery addresses pre-existing inequities.





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
